Here is a summary of the contributions they have made to the club over the years.

<u>Owen Kreilis</u>

Owen has been a Committee Member for a period of 33 years. This alone is exceptional and is way beyond what could be expected from any member. During this time he has served in various roles.

He was Catering Officer for at least 10 years in the earlier days. This was a major role in the successful operation of the club. Food working bees were arranged for just before the start of the season. Non-perishable goods for the whole season were ordered from the wholesaler in Wollongong and transport (usually by members) was arranged for delivery to Maranatha. These were then packed into the dry goods pantry which was where the Manager's bathroom is now. Meat for the whole season was ordered for delivery during the food weekend and was packed into freezers. Potatoes, pumpkins and onions were purchased from Robertson and taken to the Lodge.

Table wine was provided for dinner in those days and also had to be ordered. Wine was available for purchase by Members and this had to be ordered and transported to Maranatha usually by the Catering Officer. (This was a very successful contribution to club funds.) Wine was then stacked into the "Wine" cupboard upstairs.

Owen was Social Secretary for 6 Years and was responsible for many successful Social occasions.

He was Maintenance Officer for 5 years during a period of Major Renovations to Maranatha. He was the Catering Officer again for 6 years and again for 2 years, a total of 18 years in that role.

His years on Committee would constitute that he would have attended at least 350 Committee meetings.

I feel that he has made very significant exceptional contribution to the operation of the Club over this most extended period of 33 years and most definitely qualifies for Life Membership.

Kevin Donegan

Kevin has been an active Committee Member for 27 years.

He has served as Publicity Officer for 20 years.

He was Sports Captain for 8 years. One of those years he was Publicity Officer at the same time.

He has been an Official at The Brian Donegan Memorial Interclub Event almost every year since its inception (when not competing). He has been instrumental in the Development of the event and ensuring its continuity.

In 1977 Kevin was a Member of the WOMB CUP winning team together with Brian Donegan, Kevin Waddingham and Gai Saunders.

Competed in club races virtually every year (except when overseas or interstate). Club champion 1974 and 1977 and a few wins in age categories.

Represented the club in the Illawarra Interclub (more recently known as the Brian Donegan memorial Illawarra Interclub) in the first four years and a couple of times in more recent years. As Club Captain, Kevin led our team to our first win in 1995. Also represented our club in the following X-country events: KAC, Boonoona Open, Paddy Pallin, Koscziuscko Tour, Sundeck Cup and Night Relays.

Kevin has served on a number of sub-committees and has always made himself available for these tasks.

Over 27 years on Committee, Kevin would have attended at least 290 Committee meetings. I feel that he has made very significant exceptional contribution to the Club over this most extended period and most definitely qualifies for Life Membership.

Mavis Williams

Mavis has been a Committee Member for 25 years and would have attended at least 250 Committee Meetings.

She has served on the Committee as Publicity Officer for 5 years and Secretary for 5 years. Mavis has been the Slopes/ Ski Association Representative for at least 10 years, attending meetings and reporting back to the Committee on many important issues.

She has attended numerous working Bees particularly in the last 13 years and has become well known as the Working Bee Cook.

Mavis has been a stalwart of the Committee and her input in the efficient operation of the Club has been invaluable.

I feel that she has made very significant exceptional contribution to the Club over this most extended period and most definitely qualifies for Life Membership.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Thirroul Ski Club Ltd. has been in existence for almost thirty years and is now one of the more successful ski clubs in NSW. That success is largely due to the efforts of a number of our past and present members. The club is now in a position to show recognition to those members who have made substantial contributions to the healthy status that the club now enjoys.

Accordingly, it is proposed that a category of membership known as "life membership" be included in our Articles of Association and be awarded to those members who have made the greatest contributions.

While there are many members who have made significant contributions (participating in working bees, service on committee, junior training, representing the club in competition, etc.), it would be inappropriate (and impractical) to award everyone a life membership.

To preserve the value of the award only a small number of life memberships will be made available. Consequently, high standards will be set for assessing eligibility for life member status.

It would be impossible to specify a definitive set of rules for ranking the contributions of possible contenders for life membership status. However, the following guidelines will be used.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP GUIDELINES

Basis for selection

- Significant contribution to the club over an extended period; typically, not less than 20 years
- determined by standing committee
- Nominations to come from standing committee member with basis for nomination [c/with seconder] in writing, Vote to be taken by committee at a subsequent meeting. A three-quarter majority (of full committee) is required.
