Vale Bill Torrey

Bill Torrey 12 July 1948 – 24 May 2019

For those older members of the lodge, in particular the cross-country members, it is with great sadness that I share the news that William (Bill) Torrey passed away on the 24th of May 2019. Introduced by his partner, Chris Blatch, Bill was an active member of our lodge for 30 years and will be sadly missed.

Bill passed away whilst kayaking on holiday in Sardinia with Chris. A wonderful celebration of Bill's life was held at the Sydney University Grandstand Sports Bar on Thurs 20th Jun 19. Below is a copy of a speech given by one of our lodge members, Zoe Pearcy.

Roast and a Toast to Bill Torrey

- Bill was a very colourful man, full of life, laugh and laughter. He had many personas
- Bill was also known as;
- Bongo Bill he would regularly get up on stage and join the Band at the Man or the White Spider at The Eiger and play the bongos - brilliantly – a Star act, and random strangers would chant "Bongo Bill" "Bongo Bill". The next day on the slopes you would hear people yell out "there goes Bongo Bill!"
- Billiards Bill If there was no band and no bongos, Bill also had the chance to show off part of his misspent youth (of hanging out in pool halls)

And BILL would hold the table all night! Two quick stories; Bill and my husband nearly died one night in Perisher as a result of this misspent youth — the Maranatha crew had been celebrating at the Smiggins Pub, Bill and my husband were playing pool and as per usual were holding the table. We left them there, thinking they would catch the next snow cat back to the lodge. They ended up holding the table till 3 am, they got kicked out and had to walk 3km back to the lodge. A raging blizzard had struck up, the temperature had plummeted, wind chill was minus 20 and they had to walk into the gale force head winds, through waist high snow drifts, blind drunk. I was too happy to see them stumble into the lodge at 4:40amto be angry with them.

- The second Billiard Bill story, Chris and Bill were at a party at The Lansdowne Pub in the city, and on their way out they thought they would play some pool to sober up. Similarly, they held the table till 4am, they left to go home, but the fresh air got to Bill and somehow Bill ended up in the gutter outside Broadway. Bill also happened to be wearing his mother's see- through pink satin pyjamas.... I will stop there, and Chris can fill you in it's hilarious.
- Butterscotch Schnapps Bill a tradition of Bill's at the ski lodge. He would make his own butterscotch schnapps and at the end of a long day's skiing, you would walk in the door to be greeted by Bill with his cheeky, lovely smile on his face and his FAMOUS home-made schnapps Jenny Andrew commented when she first met Bill 30 years ago with the schnapps, she thought, this could be a bit awkward, maybe a bit dodgy and then not a fan of schnapps, politely took it and with one sip was converted! not realising that this was Bill's job and was a world class influencer in this area!

had to be brave to go away with Chris, because as anyone who has been away with Chris, knows that it can be challenging and always interesting, always searching and hunting and gathering up and finding her stuff that she loses. Recently, Bill drove at 4.30 in the morning from the inner city to the Northern Beaches just to collect Chrissy's mobile that she left behind at my place. He was proud of his round trip only taking 30 minutes...... (a record perhaps??)

Bill particularly loved being on the water but had an intense dislike of being IN the water. He would mind the bags, the food and the alcohol, whilst we were all snorkelling, surfing etc. and woe betide any suspicious character looking like they might muscle in our spot!

• Brazen Bill - a particularly lovely memory I have with Bill, is the time he got me up on the dance floor and we won the Dancing Competition at the Sydney Jazz Club Australia Day Party – held on a ferry on Sydney harbour. This ended up involving a pole!! – That happened to be in the middle of the dance floor. AND so, with plenty of bumping and grinding, Bill and I quickly improvised and instead of jiving, we pole danced! It was worth it because our prize was French champagne for the rest of the night. Bill was responsible for the worst hangover I have ever experienced. The next day was my first day in my new job at a conservative Christian School. A complete contrast to say the least.

And what did Bill do the next day? - he flew First Class to Singapore for work.

 Beautiful Bill - Bill was a keen cross-country competitor and he always took it upon himself to encourage and help those skiers not as strong as he was. An example of this is that Instead of charging off with the rest of the pack, Bill was always very content to ski alongside with his ski buddy Gordon all the way from Perisher to Charlottes Pass.

- Bill was also known as "The Phantom", "The Missile" and Achmeed". - Bill dressed up as the Phantom for the Perisher Cross Country Night Progressive Dinner tour and kept his character all night and skied in the outfit the next day.
- He was the missile when he stepped out of a snowcat and missed his footing and shot off down the hill only to be stopped by a large granite boulder which sliced his scalp and ended up with 34 interesting sutures. I say interesting sutures because the Perisher Medical centre personnel were having a Party. Thank God for Chris, she took charge. Bill was the talk of the Perisher the next day and he wore a very interesting turban/bandage. Which earnt him the nickname of Achmeed! Naturally Bill, fell into this nickname and role-played a person of Middle Eastern descent.









Bill was "out of the box Bill"- one of a kind. He died doing what he loved the most. On an adventure, in a remote part of the world with his beloved Chrissy. His memories and stories live on in our hearts. **RIP BILL**.

Advice to Guests to Minimise Lodge Maintenance Costs

During the upgrade of the showers on level 2 and level 3 during 2019 a number of enhancements were included into the showers such as larger capacity exhaust fans, heated floors and lockable windows.

The new larger capacity exhaust fans are capable of exhausting steam from the cubicles in a very short time hence there is no need for the windows in the cubicles to be opened.

During the recent junior training weekend on the evening of 30 June a guest opened the shower window wide open on level 2 and left the window open all night. During the night after severe weather the cubicle was saturated with rainwater and caused damaged to the exhaust fan circuits and will cost several hundred dollars to rectify the damage.

During winter if windows are left open it also is a waste of heating energy and results in increased lodge heating costs.

The manager has been advised to keep these windows locked to avoid a reoccurrence of this incident unless there is a good reason to unlock the windows eg. an exhaust fan failure.

I seek your co- operation to minimise the maintenance costs.
