TSC Working Bee Report May 2019

The working bee is now complete with all work achieved, in a safe manner during mixed weather conditions.

The lodge is ready for winter and I will list the major work carried out as follows:

- **New lounges** transported to the lodge by Ian Gregory saving us \$1000 in transport costs. The new lounges look good with the exception of the wooden legs than need to be a different colour. The armrests are a convenient place to position drinks so we need to consider whether we have a lots of coasters to protect the lounges. We had 3 incidents of people kicking their toes on the wooden legs.
 - The old lounges were taken to the Jindabyne dump at a cost of \$38.00. We decided to relocate a 3 seater lounge to level 3 and dump one 2 seater from level 3 which was in worst condition. We have retained several leather cushions in case we have a ripped lounge upstairs .as an extra seat.
- Vacuum Cleaners .We found several vacuums chock a block full of dust and when one of the Dysons was started it would not operate so Mark Phillips bought it back to Wollongong and

- repaired it, thermal overload trip Saving \$669 for a replacement. We need to put a system in place where guests empty the vacuum cleaners when they are full.
- Firewood, We stacked 7 cubic metres of firewood as well as cut down several trees that were overhanging the lodge.
- Pest Control Inspection. Inspection carried out and passed with flying colours. All compliance certificates for gas, water, electricity and pest control have been handed to Karen Field at NPWS on 6th May 2019.
- Test & Tag register. Ian Eddy and Geoff Young identified all electrical appliances so can have better control on test and tagging equipment.
- Defibrillator. Found to be faulty on arrival at the lodge.
 Changed battery and unit would not respond. Sent faulty unit to Sydney agent and after discussions with agent and decided it is more economical to get a new one rather than send unit to Italy for repair.
- Rendering of hall wall level 2 completed by John Hefko, looks good, a new trap door is being organised.
- Water Leak. arrested a major source of water ingress into lodge above the entrance foyer door (a major job).
- Insulated wall panel above level emergency exit door.
- Repaired level 3 ceiling cornice avoiding the use of contractor as Ken Lucas arranged free scaffolding a saving of in the order of \$1500.
- Use a camera to check cavity between level 3 roof and ceiling and there is no insulation installed. Ian Eddy and Amie's husband are evaluating options for improved heating and insulating as it was freezing in the lounge last weekend.
- Currently organising for a new skidoo windscreen from USA as our repairer did not get a screen as he only wants to sell us a new skidoo.
- Linen, Blankets, Pillows. Bruce did a sterling job of sorting out all the linen etc, we now have all blankets laundered for \$12 per blanket or less, 20 new pillows in the lodge and stacked

- sets of sheets in the linen cupboards, Bruce will update us on future linen needs .
- Water Isolation by Summer guests . On advice from plumber and electrician we dug up some pavers and identified water supply lines for proposed electrical isolation valve installation .
- General routine maintenance. We carried out a lot of other maintenance which I will identify in another report.
- We left a minor amount of frozen food in guest fridge for Clark as he will be at the lodge very soon contrary to a recent committee motion.

We had 15 volunteers who made a good contribution and avoided the cost of contractors which, I estimate, would equate to about \$31,500 from the working bee in man-hours.
